Corridor History:

The Woonasquatucket River Greenway

<u>1994</u>:


- Fred Lippitt, Chair of the Providence Plan, creates Woonasquatucket River Greenway Project (WRGP), to help revitalize Olneyville
 - Most economically challenged neighborhood in PVD
 - ✓ No safe parks
 - ✓ 60% of people do not own cars

1998:

- Woonasquatucket River designated an American Heritage River
- <u>2001:</u>
 - Woonasquatucket River Watershed Council (WRWC) is created

Corridor History:

The Woonasquatucket River Greenway

- <u>2001</u>:
 - First on-road segment of Greenway completed from Providence Place Mall to Valley Street
- <u>2006 2014</u>:
 - Kinsley Ave to Lyman Ave in Johnston off-road sections completed
 - Buttonhole Golf Course off-road
 - Eagle Square off-road
 - Donigian Park off-road
 - Woonasquatucket Adventure Park off-road







Corridor History:

The Woonasquatucket River Greenway

Today:

- 75 acres of parkland created along river
- 6 well used public parks created or revitalized
- 7 miles of on-road/off-road Greenway in Providence and Johnston

WOONASQUATUCKET RIVER WATERSHED COUNCIL

- Invasive plants managed on all 7 miles
- Red Shed Bike Camp teaches 100 kids to ride on Greenway every summer
- Leveraged over \$120M for Greenway, Parks































Alternative modes of transportation are popular in and around the project corridor, indicating a need for high quality bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure

Micromobility Map










- Map shows locations with higher number of crashes

Crash Data












