















Completed Entire Survey

- My household uses electricity, but we do not get a bill (for example, electricity costs are included in























Interaction with Existing System




Questions After Video #1

- One had frustration with National Grid in general













- 11 of 12 said it was "To get more renewable energy"
 - o 3 of these said it was also "To get lower prices"
 - 1 of these said it was also "To get more stable rates"

- Only 1 said that the only reason was "To get lower prices"
 - This respondent had household income over \$100k

"There's not a clear place to compare plans. Reluctance to deal with two companies."

"I'm not really aware of my choices, and the only choices I am aware of are the scammy-seeming folks who go door-to-door asking me to switch, which I don't want to engage with."

"I had another provider and the price increased. I switched back to National Grid and have not shopped around again"


- "I'm pleased with N. Grid service, and support. I have had 2 outings in the past 9 years and both were fixed very quickly. This reliability is important to me."

Preferences for CCA




Preferences: Weighted Averages Shown Higher is preferred more






Existing Use of Extra Renewable Energy





Willingness to Pay for Renewable Energy






