**Staff Report:** Bike Share Launch Update (For Discussion)

Presented at September 4, 2018 BPAC meeting

### **Project Background**

The City's new bike share system, operated by JUMP Bikes, will be launching in early September. This discussion will include a station map and details of system operations.

### **Launch Details**

- Installation of wave racks has begun
- Some bikes available starting this week
- All 400 bikes available by September 15
- Group ride on September 20
- Charging stations will be added on a rolling basis after launch
- \$2 for 30 minutes, \$0.07/min after that
- \$25 fee for locking outside system area
- Cash payment at PayNearMe locations at CVS, 7-Eleven, and Family Dollar locations
- Boost plan (\$5 for first year, \$5/mo after first year, 60 min free riding per day) available to recipients
  of SNAP, WIC, RIWorks, RIPTA reduced fare pass, households receiving RIDE free/reduced-price
  lunch, and residents of Providence Housing Authority residences.
- Charge lasts approximately 30 miles depending on use.
- Bikes will stay out in the winter, including snow events. JUMP operations staff will clear snow from the wave racks.
- JUMP is working with the Rhode Island Bicycle Coalition to offer two smart cycling classes this fall.


