I write this letter in support of Peter Kammerer and his project at 245 Carpenter Street. Peter grew up in Providence and this project is an expansion of a family-owned business that has been on North Main Street since the 1960s. Peter has lived in the West End for almost a decade. He now owns a home and is raising a family on Hudson Street. Peter cares deeply about the city of Providence and his neighborhood community. Peter is a sensitive and thoughtful person, and he has brought that extreme care to the project at 245 Carpenter Street.

The aspect of Luongo Square has been greatly enhanced over the past few years by the renovation and repair of the historic buildings on the square and the creation of a park-like island that features a fountain designed to replicate the horse fountain that once existed there. Businesses like the Avery and Big King have thrived in the square, as have businesses adjacent to the square like Bucktown and the E&O. Like Peter's project proposal, many of these businesses occupy sites that are historically commercial spaces. Bucktown was the Fountain Spa. The Avery was the Decatur Lounge.
