Subject: Providence Community – Police Relations Act 1st Quarter Report 2019.

Effective January 1 2018, The Municipal Ordinance known as the Providence Community-Police Relations Act (PCRA) went in to effect. Accordingly, there are certain quarterly requirements under "Section (i) (4) Accountability and enforcement" that the Providence police Department needs to prepare and make available to the Providence External Review Authority, the public and the city council.

From January through March 2019 there were 3 complaints that fall under the reporting requirements of the PCPRA:

- 1) Complaint of unlawful search. Our investigation did not find any evidence of this. Once this was communicated to the complainants they withdrew their complaint.
- Complaint of failure to identify. Our investigation revealed that the officer never heard the request for identification. Once this was communicated to the complainant the complaint was withdrawn.
- 3) Complaint of unlawful motor vehicle search. The investigation has found no evidence of this but our investigation is ongoing.


