Bids may be submitted up to **2:15 P.M.** on the above meeting date at the **Department of the City Clerk. Room 311, City Hall. 25 Dorrance Street, Providence.** At 2:15 P.M. all bids will be publicly opened and read at the Board of Contract Meeting in the City Council Chambers, on the 3rd floor of City Hall.

- Bidders must submit 3 copies of their bid in sealed envelopes or packages labeled with the captioned Item Description and the City Department to which the RFP and bid are related and must include the company name and address on the envelope as well. (On page 1).
- If required by the Department, please keep the original bid bond and check in only one of the envelopes.
- Communications to the Board of Contract and Supply that are not competitive sealed bids (i.e. product information/samples) should have "**NOT A BID**" written on the envelope or wrapper.
- Only use form versions and templates included in this RFP. If you have an old version of a form <u>do not</u> recycle it for use in this bid.

Failure to follow instructions could result in information considered private being posted to the city's Open Meetings Portal and made available as a public record. The City has made a conscious effort to avoid the posting of sensitive information on the City's Open Meetings Portal, by requesting that such sensitive information be submitted to the issuing department only at their request.

***Failure to meet specified deadlines, follow specific submission instructions, or enclose all required documents with all applicable signatures will result in disqualification, or in an inability to appropriately evaluate bids.



NOTICE TO VENDORS

- 1. The Board of Contract and Supply will make the award to the lowest qualified and responsible bidder.
- 2. In determining the lowest responsible bidder, cash discounts based on preferable payment terms will not be considered.
- 3. Where prices are the same, the Board of Contract and Supply reserves the right to award to one bidder, or to split the award.
- 4. No proposal will be accepted if the bid is made in collusion with any other bidder.
- 5. Bids may be submitted on an "equal in quality" basis. The City reserves the right to decide equality. Bidders must indicate brand or the make being offered and submit detailed specifications if other than brand requested.
- 6. A bidder who is an out-of-state corporation shall qualify or register to transact business in this State, in accordance with the Rhode Island Business Corporation Act, RIGL Sec. 7-1.2-1401, et seq.
- 7. The Board of Contract and Supply reserves the right to reject any and all bids.
- 8. Competing bids may be viewed in person at the Department of the City Clerk, City Hall, Providence, immediately upon the conclusion of the formal Board of Contract and Supply meeting during which the bids were unsealed/opened. Bids may also be accessed electronically on the internet via the City's Open Meetings Portal.
- 9. As the City of Providence is exempt from the payment of Federal Excise Taxes and Rhode Island Sales Tax, prices quoted are not to include these taxes.
- 10. In case of error in the extension of prices quoted, the unit price will govern.
- 11. The contractor will **NOT** be permitted to: a) assign or underlet the contract, or b) assign either legally or equitably any monies or any claim thereto without the previous written consent of the City Purchasing Director.
- 12. Delivery dates must be shown in the bid. If no delivery date is specified, it will be assumed that an immediate delivery from stock will be made.
- 13. A certificate of insurance will normally be required of a successful vendor.
- 14. For many contracts involving construction, alteration and/or repair work, State law provisions concerning payment of prevailing wage rates apply (RIGL Sec. 37-13-1 et seq.)
- 15. No goods should be delivered or work started without a Purchase Order.
- 16. Submit 3 copies of the bid to the City Clerk, unless the specification section of this document indicates otherwise.
- 17. Bidder must certify that it does not unlawfully discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, gender, gender identity or expression, sexual orientation and/or religion in its business and hiring practices and that all of its employees are lawfully employed under all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations. BID TERMS

1.	Financial assurances may be required in order to be a successful bidder for Commodity or Construction and Service contracts. If either of the first two checkboxes below is checked, the specified assurance
	must accompany a bid, or the bid will not be considered by the Board of Contract and Supply. The third checkbox indicates the lowest responsible bidder will be contacted and required to post a bond to be awarded the contract.
	a) A certified check for must be deposited with the City Clerk as a guarantee that the Contract will be signed and delivered by the bidder.
	b) A bid bond in the amount of per centum (%) of the proposed total price, must be deposited with the City Clerk as a guarantee that the contract will be signed and delivered by the bidder; and the amount of such bid bond shall be retained for the use of the City as liquidated damages in case of default.

- 3. Failure to deliver within the time quoted or failure to meet specifications may result in default in accordance with the general specifications. It is agreed that deliveries and/or completion are subject to strikes, lockouts, accidents and Acts of God.

The following entry applies only for COMMODITY BID TERMS:

- 4. Payment for partial delivery will not be allowed except when provided for in blanket or term contracts. The following entries apply only for CONSTRUCTION AND SERVICE BID TERMS:
 - 5. Only one shipping charge will be applied in the event of partial deliveries for blanket or term contracts.
 - 6. Prior to commencing performance under the contract, the successful bidder shall attest to compliance with the provisions of the Rhode Island Worker's Compensation Act, RIGL 28-29-1, et seq. If exempt from compliance, the successful bidder shall submit a sworn Affidavit by a corporate officer to that effect, which shall accompany the signed contract.
 - 7. Prior to commencing performance under the contract, the successful bidder shall, submit a certificate of insurance, in a form and in an amount satisfactory to the City.

WBE/MBE Form Instructions

The City of Providence actively seeks Minority and Women business enterprises to participate in bids to meet the City's procurement needs. Pursuant to the City of Providence Code of Ordinances, Chapter 21, Article II, Sec. 21-52 (Minority and Women's Business Enterprise) and Rhode Island General Laws (as amended), Chapter 31-14, et seq. (Minority Business Enterprise), Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) and Women's Business Enterprise (WBE) participation goals apply to contracts.

The goal for Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) participation is **10%** of the total bid value. The goal for Women's Business Enterprise (WBE) participation is **10%** of the total bid value. The goal for combined MBE/WBE participation is **20%** of the total bid value.

Only businesses certified with the State of Rhode Island as minority and/or women business enterprises are counted towards the City's goals. Eligible minority or women-owned businesses are encouraged to seek certification from the State of Rhode Island Minority Business Enterprise Compliance Office at: http://odeo.ri.gov/offices/mbeco/

Note: MBE certification with the State of Rhode Island on the basis of Portuguese heritage is not currently recognized by the City of Providence's MBE program.

Bid Requirements:

All Bidders: All bidders must complete and submit the MBE/WBE Participation Affidavit indicating whether or not they are a state-certified MBE/WBE and acknowledging the City's participation goals. Submission of this form is required with every bid. Your bid will not be accepted without an affidavit.

Bidders who will be subcontracting: Bidders who will be subcontracting must submit the **Subcontractor Disclosure Form** as part of their bid submission. All subcontractors, regardless of MBE/WBE status, must be listed on this form. Business NAICS codes can be found at https://www.naics.com/search/. Awarded bidders are required to submit **Subcontractor Utilization and Payment Reports** with each invoice.

Waiver Requests:

If the percentage of the total amount of the bid being awarded to MBE or WBE vendors is less than 20% (Box F on the Subcontractor Disclosure Form) and the prime contractor is not a Rhode Island State-certified MBE or WBE, the Bidder must complete the *MBE/WBE Waiver Request Form* for review. Waivers will be considered on a case by case basis.

No waiver will be granted unless the waiver request includes documentation that demonstrates that the Bidder has made good faith efforts to achieve the City's stated participation goals. Waivers must be reviewed and signed by the City of Providence's MBE/WBE Outreach Director, Grace Diaz, or her designee. Department Directors cannot recommend a bidder for award if this form is applicable and absent. If the bid does not meet the participation goals of the City of Providence and a waiver is not filed with the signature of the MBE/WBE Outreach Director or her designee, the bid will not be accepted.

Verifying MBE/WBE Certification

It is the responsibility of the bidder to confirm that every MBE/WBE named in a proposal and included in a contract is certified by the Rhode Island Minority Business Enterprise Compliance office. For contracts with duration of less than 3 months, this form must be submitted along with the contractor's request for final payment. The form must include all subcontractors utilized on the contract, both MBE/WBE and non- MBE/WBE, the total amount paid to each subcontractor for the given period and to date. During the term of the contract, any unjustified failure to comply with the MBE/WBE participation requirements is a material breach of contract.

Certificate of Insurance

- 1. The <u>Original</u> Certificate of Insurance must be sent to the Providence Water Supply Board, 552 Academy Avenue, Providence, RI 02908 ATTN: **Joseph Spremulli**
- Certificate must be completely filled out listing all Insurance Companies, Coverages, and Limits. The Providence Water Supply Board (PWSB) requires the following insurance requirements.
 - A) Worker's Compensation and Occupational Disease Insurance: Worker's Compensation and Occupational Disease Insurance, In statutory amounts, Covering all employees of the contractor. Employer's liability coverage with limits of not less than \$500,000 each accident or illness shall be included.
 - B) Commercial General Liability Insurance:

Commercial Liability Insurance with limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence, for bodily injury and/or property damage liability \$2,000,000 in the aggregate. Products/completed operation, independent contractors, and contractual liability coverages are to be included. No exclusions for rigging, hoisting, explosions, collapse and/or underground. Completed operations coverage must remain in effect for a period not less than 2 years after the completion of all work. "The City of Providence, Providence Water Supply Board, its officers and agents are to be named as an additional insured".

C) Automobile Liability Insurance:

When any motor vehicles are used in connection with the work to be performed the Contractor shall maintain Automobile Liability Insurance with limits of not less \$1,000,000 per occurrence, combined single limit, for bodily injury and property damage. "The City of Providence, Providence Water Supply Board are to be named as additionally insured".

D) Builder's Risk Policy:

When a free standing unit is to be constructed or any addition to our facilities made in connection with the work specified, the Contractor must provide Builder's Risk Insurance or an Installation Floater covering all risks with limits equal to the award of the contract.

E) Professional Liability Insurance:

When any architects, engineers, or consulting firms perform work in connection with any contract, the contractor shall maintain Professional Liability Insurance with limits not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence and aggregate.

- 3. The insured name must be the same name as the name on the bid submitted
- 4. Insurance Certificates should state the <u>Title of Project</u> to be performed. (PLEASE SEE THE ATTACHED SAMPLE)
- 5. Certificate must read that "The City of Providence, Providence Water Supply Board, its Officers and Agents are named as additional insured."
- 6. Certificate Holder provision of the certificates must list "The City of Providence and the Providence Water Supply Board."
- 7. Cancellation and/or reduction in coverage must provide **30 days** written notice.
- 8. The successful bidder must produce a satisfactory Certificate of Insurance within 10 days after award. No work will begin or contract signed unless all these requirements are met. Failure to do so may result in the cancellation of the award and award to another bidder.

The insurances specified shall be carried until all work required to be performed under the terms of the CONTRACTOR's services are satisfactorily completed and for a period of at least two years after the date when final payment becomes due. Failure to carry or keep such insurance in force shall constitute a violation of the contract, and the Providence Water Supply Board maintains the right to stop work and/or withhold payment until proper evidence is provided.

The insurance shall provide for 30 days prior written notice to be given to the Providence Water Supply Board in the event coverage is substantially changed, canceled, or not renewed.

In no case shall the coverage limits stated for Commercial General Liability, Automobile Liability, or Professional Liability insurance stated above be less than the total contract amount. If the total contract amount exceeds any stated limit the limit shall be adjusted to the satisfaction of the OWNER to the next highest \$1,000,000 exceeding the total contract amount.

The Providence Water Supply Board maintains the right to modify, delete, alter or change these requirements.

The successful bidder understands and agrees that any insurance protection furnished by the Contractor hereunder shall in no way limit its responsibility to indemnify and save harmless the Providence Water Supply Board.

Introduction

Providence Water (PW) is seeking responses from firms interested in providing arbitrage rebate compliance services for all outstanding bonds currently held and any future bonds issued by PW. RFP respondents must meet the Minimum Qualifications set out in this RFP.

This agreement will be for a 5-year term.

PW sells water to approximately 76,800 retail customer connections including houses and businesses in Providence, Johnston, North Providence, Cranston and East Smithfield and to 7 wholesale communities serving a number of additional municipalities within the State. Providence Water presently supplies approximately 60 percent of the state's drinking water. Of the water produced, 36 percent is supplied to the residents of Providence, 22 percent to the retail districts outside of Providence, and 42 percent goes to the wholesale water districts.

Scope of Services

The successful responder shall provide for each issue, but not limited to, the following:

- 1. Assess all outstanding bond issues to determine the existing level of arbitrage compliance and future compliance needs.
- 2. Calculate bond yields.
- 3. Calculate excess investment earnings, if any, required to be rebated to the Federal Government within the legally permitted time period.
- 4. As appropriate, calculate any yield reduction amount on any funds that are yield restricted.
- 5. Provide a report identifying amounts of arbitrage. Reports are to be prepared annually through fiscal year end (8/31) and at 5 year intervals on the anniversary dates of the bond.
- 6. Assist the as necessary in the event of an Internal Revenue Service (IRS) inquiry.
- 7. Provide consultation as necessary regarding arbitrage matters.
- 8. Provide assistance and consultation as necessary to retain records and documentation at least six (6) years after the issue's final maturity.
- 9. Provide documentation certifying arbitrage calculation results are consistent with the 1986 Rebate Provisions, as amended.
- 10. Prepare necessary reports and IRS forms to accompany any required payment to the Federal Government.
- 11. See Appendix A for current list of bond issues.

Minimum Qualifications for RFQ Respondents

To be considered as a provider of arbitrage rebate compliance services to PWSB, a firm's response to the RFQ must demonstrate that the respondent meets the following Minimum Qualifications:

Description of the firm:

1. The firm must be licensed to do business in the State of Rhode Island

- 2. Provide name, title and office location of person who will be the principal contact for the PW and the billing location if different.
- 3. Confirm your company carries Professional Liability Insurance, Errors and Omissions coverage or Fidelity Bond.

Description of experience:

- 1. Describe the responder's experience in providing arbitrage calculation services (e.g. how long has the responder been providing rebate services.) Include an example of a report issued by the office having primary responsibilities for carrying out the provisions of this RFP and the resulting contract.
- 2. Provide detail on the approach the Responder would use for the PW to remain in compliance with Federal arbitrage rules for the period of the contract. Please address issues such as restricted and unrestricted periods and yield reduction payments.
- 3. Provide a brief explanation of differing methods of calculation and identify the method(s) the responder recommends and why.
- 4. Identify the information and assistance you will require from PW staff in completing the calculations. Include your needs for bond issuance and investment information, and any special reports that may be required.
- 5. Provide an estimate of the time it will take to complete the tasks listed herein and describe the follow-up consultation to include services available after completion of said tasks.
- 6. Describe your ability and availability for future and/or additional rebate services (e.g. new bond issues subject to rebate).
- 7. How you would propose to handle amending your calculations if there are new IRS regulations or guidance from the IRS.
- 8. Indicate how you propose to handle a change in your interpretation of arbitrage rules.
