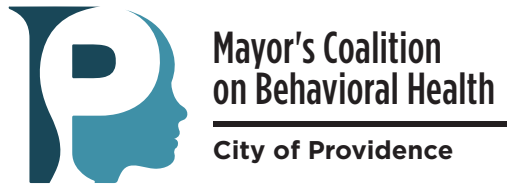

# A Note from the Healthy Communities Office Director

**Dear Providence residents, community providers and other partners,**

Welcome to the City of Providence Healthy Communities Office Mental and Behavioral Health Resource Guide.

Rhode Island is often cited for having unusually high rates of mental illness and substance misuse. While this may sound like there are more instances of mental health crisis or substance misuse here than in other places, it may actually reflect that Rhode Islanders are very aware of available mental health resources and more likely to seek services.

Despite these high rates of individuals seeking services, we realize that many Providence residents may not know where to access the best mental healthcare services for themselves or their family members — or may not even think to take the first step towards finding care. That is the goal of this guide — to give you and your loved ones the resources you need to seek services if you are in need of support.

A report titled “The State of Mental Health in America 2022” by Mental Health America (MHA) found that:

- 1.** Out of the over 50 million Americans living with mental illness, 24% have an unmet need for treatment. This number has not declined since 2011.
- 2.** More than half of adults with a mental illness do not receive treatment.
- 3.** Of youth with severe depression who are receiving treatment, only 27% receive constant care.
- 4.** 8.1% of children have private insurance that does not cover mental health services.
- 5.** 11.1% of Americans with a mental illness are uninsured.
- 6.** 10.6% of youth in the U.S. have severe major depression. This rate is higher (14.5%) among youth who identify as more than one race.

These statistics show that there is still work to be done to improve the availability and accessibility of mental and behavioral healthcare, especially for children. We know that several needs exist in Rhode Island; in 2021, 6,460 children under age 18 were treated at local Community Mental Health Organizations (Rhode Island KIDS COUNT Factbook, 2022). We hope that the information in this guide will empower more individuals to take advantage of the services and support available in and around Providence.

**If you or someone you know is experiencing emotional or behavioral challenges, please know that there are resources available for you.** Most people do not hesitate to go to the doctor for a physical health concern, like a broken bone, and we should treat mental health the same way. If you are not sure whether your mental or emotional state is something to be concerned about, it is worth seeking out a provider to ask. Your primary healthcare physician is a good place to start. We hope that this guide will connect you to other valuable resources in our community as well.

**The 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline** (formerly known as the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline) offers 24/7 call, text and chat access to trained crisis counselors who can help people experiencing suicidal, substance use, and/or mental health crisis, or any other kind of emotional distress. People can also dial 988 if they are worried about a loved one who may need crisis support. In Rhode Island, 988 calls are answered by BH Link.

# About This Guide

Each entry in this resource guide details a different organization that serves the Providence community, including the services the organization provides, the clients they serve, any special programs the organization offers, the language(s) the organization speaks and the forms of payment that are accepted by the organization. While we strive to provide the most current information, please note that organization services may change and contacting the organization directly will provide you with the most up-to-date information.

The Resource Guide is divided into five **primary focus sections** to help you quickly find the most relevant resources.

- 1. Basic Needs** – Clothing, Case Management, Crime Victims Support, Domestic Violence Programming, Education and Employment Services, Emergency Food, Emergency Housing Assistance, Health Education, Legal Clinic, Mortgage Assistance, Prescription Assistance, Rental Assistance, Temporary Housing and Utility Assistance.
- 2. Children, Youth and Families** – Programs Mainly Focused On The Family Unit and Child Welfare and Mothers. Specialized resources for Spanish-speaking and LGBTQ+ residents are included.
- 3. Inpatient Treatment** – Hospitalization and Addiction Recovery Resources.
- 4. Mental Health and Recovery Services** – Behavioral Healthcare and Outpatient Treatment Services.
- 5. Other Services** – Resources whose focus areas are important to mental health, but cannot specifically be categorized into the previous sections.



## Types of Services

For each organization listed in this guide, we list a keyword for the types of services the organization provides. Below are the definitions of the service keywords included in this guide.

**Day Treatment** – Partial hospitalization where a patient resides at home but commutes to treatment.

**Helplines/Hotlines** – Phone-based emotional, social and/or financial support through peer-to-peer interactions.

**HIV/STD** – Specialized programs, advocacy or support for individuals affected by HIV/AIDS or other sexually transmitted diseases.

**Housing or Temporary Residence** – Shelters and supportive community organizations that provide refuge.

**Insurance** – Support and information regarding Medicare, Medicaid, private and other types of insurance.

**Mental Health Services** – Support and treatment for individuals or families affected by mental health conditions.

**Outpatient** – Medical treatment provided without admittance to a hospital.

**Prescription Assistance** – Discounts, programs or other means to help with payment for prescriptions.

**Psychiatric Services** – The study, diagnosis and treatment of affective, behavioral, cognitive and perceptual mental disorders.

**Recovery Support Services** – Removal of obstacles before and during recovery as well as enhancement of quality of life for people in recovery and their families.

**Residential Treatment** – Live-in healthcare facility providing therapy and treatment for substance use disorders.

## Forms of Payment Accepted

Whenever possible, we list the methods of payment accepted by each organization for their services (if required). Below are the definitions of the forms of payment included in this guide.

**Employer-Sponsored/Private Insurance** – Health plan provided through an employer or by an individual through a private company.

**Free - All Services** – All interactions and services are free of charge.

**Free - Limited Services** – Some but not all services are free of charge.

**Medicaid** – Largest source of funding for medical health-related services for people with low income in the United States.

**Medicare** – Social service that guarantees access to health insurance for Americans over 65 years of age.

**Out of Pocket** – Compensation for services covered by money of an individual rather than another source.

**Sliding Scale Fee** – Payment methods that vary based on income or other factors.

**Tricare** – Healthcare insurance program of the United States Department of Defense Military Health System. Generally used by military families.

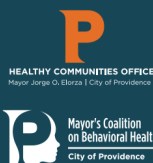

It's a great time to clean out your medicine cabinet! Protect our kids, families and environment by properly disposing of your unwanted and expired medicines. Medicines in the home are a leading cause of accidental poisoning, and flushed or trashed medicines can end up polluting our waters. Rates of prescription drug abuse are alarmingly high, and over half of teens abusing medicines get them from a family member or friend — including the home medicine cabinet — and often without their knowledge.

### RETURN UNUSED AND EXPIRED PRESCRIPTION DRUGS FREE. ANONYMOUS. NO QUESTIONS ASKED.



Unused and expired medicines that remain in medicine cabinets or other accessible locations in the home increase the risk of prescription drug misuse and abuse. Dispose of your unwanted and expired prescription drugs safely using the tips below.

#### HOW TO USE A MEDRETURN BIN

**MedReturn bins CAN accept:** prescription patches, prescription medications, prescription ointments, over-the-counter medications, vitamins, medication samples and pet medications.

**MedReturn bins CANNOT accept:** liquids, thermometers, hydrogen peroxide, inhalers, aerosol cans, lotions and "sharps" (i.e. needles, lancets, syringes and IVs).

Residents with needles are encouraged to return them to AIDS Care Ocean State's needle exchange program. Call (401) 521-3603 for more information.

**Deposit pills in clear plastic bags. Do not include pill bottles that display personal medical information.**
