### **NOTICE TO VENDORS**

- 1. The Board of Contract and Supply will make the award to the lowest qualified and responsible bidder.
- 2. In determining the lowest responsible bidder, cash discounts based on preferable payment terms will not be considered.
- 3. Where prices are the same, the Board of Contract and Supply reserves the right to award to one bidder, or to split the award.
- 4. No proposal will be accepted if the bid is made in collusion with any other bidder.
- 5. Bids may be submitted on an "equal in quality" basis. The City reserves the right to decide equality. Bidders must indicate brand or the make being offered and submit detailed specifications if other than brand requested.
- 6. A bidder who is an out-of-state corporation shall qualify or register to transact business in this State, in accordance with the Rhode Island Business Corporation Act, RIGL Sec. 7-1.2-1401, et seq.
- 7. The Board of Contract and Supply reserves the right to reject any and all bids.
- 8. Competing bids may be viewed in person at the Department of the City Clerk, City Hall, Providence, immediately upon the conclusion of the formal Board of Contract and Supply meeting during which the bids were unsealed/opened. Bids may also be accessed electronically on the internet via the City's Open Meetings Portal.
- 9. As the City of Providence is exempt from the payment of Federal Excise Taxes and Rhode Island Sales Tax, prices quoted are not to include these taxes.
- 10. In case of error in the extension of prices quoted, the unit price will govern.
- 11. The contractor will **NOT** be permitted to: a) assign or underlet the contract, or b) assign either legally or equitably any monies or any claim thereto without the previous written consent of the City Purchasing Director.
- 12. Delivery dates must be shown in the bid. If no delivery date is specified, it will be assumed that an immediate delivery from stock will be made.
- 13. A certificate of insurance will normally be required of a successful vendor.
- 14. For many contracts involving construction, alteration and/or repair work, State law provisions concerning payment of prevailing wage rates apply (<u>RIGL Sec. 37-13-1 et seq.</u>)
- 15. No goods should be delivered, or work started without a Purchase Order.
- 16. Submit 2 copies of the bid to the City Clerk, unless the specification section of this document indicates otherwise.
- 17. Bidder must certify that it does not unlawfully discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, gender, gender identity or expression, sexual orientation and/or religion in its business and hiring practices and that all of its employees are lawfully employed under all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations. 1. Financial assurances may be required in order to be a successful bidder for Commodity or Construand Service contracts. The third checkbox indicates the lowest responsible bidder will be contacted and required to post a bor be awarded the contract.				
	a) A certified check for <u>\$</u> must be deposited with the City Clerk as a guarantee that the Contract will be signed and delivered by the bidder.			
	b) A bid bond in the amount of per centum (%) of the proposed total price, must be deposited with the City Clerk as a guarantee that the contract will be signed and delivered by the bidder; and the amount of such bid bond shall be retained for the use of the City as liquidated damages in case of default. Any person signing a bid bond as an attorney-in-fact shall include with the bid bond an original, or a photocopy or facsimile of an original, power of attorney.			
	c) A performance and payment bond with a satisfactory surety company will be posted by the bidder in a sum equal to one hundred per centum (100%) of the awarded contract.			
	d) No financial assurance is necessary for this item.			

- 2. Awards will be made within **sixty (60) days of bid opening**. All bid prices will be considered firm, unless qualified otherwise. Requests for price increases will not be honored.
- 3. Failure to deliver within the time quoted or failure to meet specifications may result in default in accordance with the general specifications. It is agreed that deliveries and/or completion are subject to strikes, lockouts, accidents, and Acts of God.

### The following entry applies only for COMMODITY BID TERMS:

4. Payment for partial delivery will not be allowed except when provided for in blanket or term contracts. The following entries apply only for CONSTRUCTION AND SERVICE BID TERMS:

- 5. Only one shipping charge will be applied in the event of partial deliveries for blanket or term contracts.
- 6. ### WBE/MBE Form Instructions

The City of Providence actively seeks Minority and Women business enterprises to participate in bids to meet the City's procurement needs. Pursuant to the City of Providence Code of Ordinances, Chapter 21, Article II, Sec. 21-52 (Minority and Women's Business Enterprise) and Rhode Island General Laws (as amended), Chapter 37-14, et seq. (Minority Business Enterprise), Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) and Women's Business Enterprise (WBE) participation goals apply to contracts.

The goal for Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) participation is 10% of the total bid value. The goal for Women's Business Enterprise (WBE) participation is 10% of the total bid value. The goal for combined MBE/WBE participation is 20% of the total bid value.

Only businesses certified with the State of Rhode Island as minority and/or women business enterprises are counted towards the City's goals. Eligible minority or women-owned businesses are encouraged to seek certification from the State of Rhode Island Minority Business Enterprise Compliance Office at: <a href="https://dedi.ri.gov/divisions-units/minority-business-enterprise-compliance-office">https://dedi.ri.gov/divisions-units/minority-business-enterprise-compliance-office</a>

**Note**: MBE certification with the State of Rhode Island on the basis of Portuguese heritage is not currently recognized by the City of Providence's MBE program.

#### **Bid Requirements:**

- 1. All Bidders: All bidders must complete and submit the MBE/WBE Participation Affidavit (page 13) indicating whether or not they are a state-certified MBE/WBE and acknowledging the City's participation goals. Submission of this form is required with every bid. Your bid will not be accepted without an affidavit.
- 2. Bidders who will be subcontracting: In addition to the MBE/WBE Participation Affidavit, Bidders who will be subcontracting must submit the Subcontractor Disclosure Form as part of their bid submission. All subcontractors, regardless of MBE/WBE status, must be listed on this form. Business NAICS codes can be found at <a href="https://www.naics.com/search/">https://www.naics.com/search/</a>. Awarded bidders are required to submit Subcontractor Utilization and Payment Reports with each invoice.

### 3. Waiver Requests:

- a) If the percentage of the total amount of the bid being awarded to MBE or WBE vendors is less than 20% (Box F on the Subcontractor Disclosure Form) and the prime contractor is not a Rhode Island State-certified MBE or WBE, the Bidder must complete the MBE/WBE Waiver Request Form (page 14) and obtain approvals prior to bid submission.
- b) If the prime contractor company has the capacity to perform the whole project, the City of Providence requires the contractor to complete the MBE/WBE Waiver Request Form (page 14) and obtain approvals prior to bid submission.
- c) If the contractor is a nonprofit organization, they are not required to complete the MBE/WBE Waiver Request Form. However, the City of Providence requires the nonprofit organization to provide the MBE/WBE Participation Affidavit Form and proof of its nonprofit status.
- d) If the contractor has researched the RI Certified minority list (<a href="https://dedi.ri.gov/divisions-units/minority-business-enterprise-compliance-office/minority-business-enterprise-mbe">https://dedi.ri.gov/divisions-units/minority-business-enterprise-compliance-office/minority-business-enterprise-mbe</a>) and the state does not have any companies in the desired trade, the contractor must complete the MBE/WBE Waiver Request Form (page 14) and obtain approvals prior to bid submission.
- e) Waivers will be considered for approval on a case-by-case basis.





### **Verifying MBE/WBE Certification**

It is the responsibility of the bidder to confirm that every MBE or WBE named in a proposal and included in a contract is certified by the Rhode Island Minority Business Enterprise Compliance Office. ### **BID PACKAGE SPECIFICATIONS**

### Introduction

The City of Providence is the capital of Rhode Island and has a population of approximately 183,000 residents. Services are delivered by more than 5,000 employees across City Departments, Providence Schools, and the Providence Water Supply Board. The Smiley Administration aims to be the "best run City in America."

The City of Providence is seeking proposals from qualified vendors for an outstanding Case Management System for the Providence External Review Authority (PERA). PERA has the mission and the authority to investigate and conduct hearings concerning allegations of misconduct on the part of sworn officers of the Providence Police Department. The purpose of this RFP is to solicit proposals from qualified vendors and select the best proposal that meets our requirements as detailed below. This system will allow citizens to easily submit compliments and complaints to PERA. PERA will use this system to manage all cases.

### **Existing Conditions and Technology**

The Providence Information Technology Department maintains and is trained in the use of Microsoft technologies, including Windows Server, SQL Server, Active Directory, IIS, and desktop Windows and Office platforms. All versions should be the latest available or one version prior. The system must be able to be implemented and integrated within a Windows environment, and must maintain interoperability with Microsoft Windows operating systems as they evolve. City employees currently use Microsoft 365.

PERA does not currently have a formal software system to manage such cases.

### **Scope of Work:**

The vendor will be responsible for providing a Case Management System that includes the following features:

### **Functional Requirements**

The Case Management System should meet the following functional requirements:

- 1. Ability for the public to submit paperless compliments and complaints through easily accessible online tool.
- 2. Ability to create, store, print and retrieve case information both by a citizen and by PERA.
- 3. User registration and login with secure password handling
- 4. Profile management and customization options
- 5. Collaboration/workflow tools for case management
- 6. Document management
- 7. Multilingual functionality
- 8. Public and private portal interfaces:
  - a. Public portal citizens would submit cases and have ability to keep track of their case.
  - b. Private portal (internal view) would keep track of all case investigations internally.
- 9. Integrated data analysis tools and data reporting tools
- 10. Automated notification status updates of cases



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- 11. Provide an application native dashboard to monitor workflow processes, procedures, and include common reporting tools to track compliments and complaints.
- 12. Provide reporting features to track complaints by type, by officer, and by location.
- 13. Built on and hosted in a fashion which meets the FBI's Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) compliance requirements.

### Proposed sample workflow:

- Constituent submits complaint with contact information and attaches files, videos, images, reports compliment or complaint online
- PERA receives notice
- Constituent gets confirmation of receipt of submission
- PERA assigns case to investigator
- Constituent gets updates when status of submission changes
- Investigator updates record in online tool/contacts constituent for more information through system
- Investigator submits report for review
- PERA reviews case
- Case receives final disposition
- PERA responds to constituent

### **Technical Requirements:**

The Case Management System should meet the following technical requirements:

- 1. Fully responsive, intuitive design, all platforms, ADA Compliant
- 2. Be web and mobile ready, accessible through and compatible with native browser and major operating systems, including at least Microsoft Edge, Chrome, Firefox, Android and iOS
- 3. Utilize high level security/encryption
- 4. Cloud based, deliverable in a software as a service (SaaS) platform
- 5. Offer an unlimited number of user licenses
- 6. User Personas:
  - a. Administrators
  - b. Users
  - c. Citizens
- 7. At least 1 TB of storage for case management
- 8. Support in browser translation or offer language accessibility to the most common languages spoken in Providence (English, Spanish, Chinese, Portuguese, Cambodian)
- 9. Ability to customize an intake portal or landing page specifically for the PERA's workflow.
- 10. Search Function of System data (both open and closed cases) should be searchable by submitting member, in addition by case name, case type, keyword or address, relationships or attributes.
- 11. Have 99.9% uptime guarantee, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week
- 12. Offer technical support at least accessible via email with a less than 24-hour response time, with a strong preference for phone call support available during normal City business hours
- 13. Be automatically backed up by the vendor daily



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- 13. The system should be scalable and able to accommodate any number simultaneous users and cases.
- 14. The system should be compatible with major operating systems, including Windows, Mac, and Linux.
- 17. The system should be easy to use and have a user-friendly interface.
- 18. The system should be customizable to meet our specific requirements.
- 20. The system should have audit trail and logging.
- 21. The system should have strong password support with the ability to support Single Sign On (SSO) authentication with Microsoft Azure AD.
- 22. The system should have online help, a knowledge base and offer support for both internal and external users.



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### **Proposal Requirements:**

The vendor must submit a proposal that includes the following:

- 24. A detailed description of the proposed Case Management System, including features, functionalities, and technical specifications.
- 25. A proposed implementation plan, including timelines, milestones, and resources required.
- 26. A proposed training plan for our staff and users.
- 28. A detailed description of a Service Level Agreement.
- 29. Delivered with an annual subscription cost, outlining costs over a five (5) year period, marked from date of the kickoff meeting, with a yearly escalating fee of no more than 5 percent (5%) annual increase
- 29. A proposed pricing plan, including licensing fees, implementation fees, and ongoing maintenance fees for an additional 3-5 years.
- 30. A list of references from previous clients who have implemented the Case Management System.
- 31. Support for internal and external users.
- 32. Demonstration of proposed system. Vendors will be contacted to schedule demonstrations prior to contract award.

### **Scope of Work System Questions:**

Please include responses to each of the following items:

- 1. How does your System utilize a web browser interface? Does it allow government agencies and vendors with internet access to utilize the System without the need to obtain any proprietary software? Which browsers is your system compatible with?
- 2. How does your System provide security features for the data transmitted through the System?
  - a. Is the System FISMA compliant? Are the servers located in the United States?
  - b. How do you encrypt data during transmission and when stored? Please describe.
- 3. Is your System dependent on Content Delivery Network's (CND) such as CloudFare, AWS, MaxCND?
- 4. Where are your data centers located?
- 5. Is each data center SSAE-16 Audited and will copies of each audit be provided prior to executing a contract?
- 6. Please provide uptime data for the past three (3) years or since inception if less than three (3) years (provide the 9's).

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#### **Demonstrations:**

We look forward to receiving proposals from qualified vendors, demonstrations of said systems and selecting the best proposal that meets our requirements.

### **Schedule and Anticipated Milestones:**

- 1. Proposer (Vendor) shall provide a schedule of all tasks and milestones from Kick-off meeting to Final Acceptance.
- 2. Completion of milestones will be tied to payment via percentages. Vendor should suggest for the City's consideration a schedule of completed project milestones and associated payments that comport with the vendor's costs in completing the requirements of the contract.

However, the City requires a substantial payment (not less than 30% of the total contract price) be tied to the final Go-Live and not less than 5% tied to Final Acceptance. A final Contract Price and schedule of payments to Vendor will be presented to the vendor after the Board of Contract and Supply meeting to approve a recommendation from the City's Case Management System working group.



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### SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION

If the issuing department for this RFP determines that your firm's bid is best suited to accommodate their need, you will be asked to provide proof of the following prior to formalizing an award.

An inability to provide the outlined items at the request of the department may lead to the disqualification of your bid.

This information is <u>NOT</u> requested to be provided in your initial bid that you will submit to the City Clerk's office by the "date to be opened" noted on page 1. This list only serves as a list of items that your firm should be ready to provide on request.

<u>All bids submitted to the City Clerk become public record</u>. Failure to follow instructions could result in information considered private being posted to the city's Open Meetings Portal and made available as a public record.

### You must be able to provide:

- Business Tax ID will be requested after an award is approved by the Board of Contract and Supply.
- Proof of Insurance.
- Certificate of Good Standing with the Rhode Island Secretary of State.



#### CITY OF PROVIDENCE STANDARD TERMS & CONDITIONS

- 1. The terms "you" and "your" contained herein refer to the person or entity that is a party to the agreement with the City of Providence ("the City") and to such person's or entity's employees, officers, and agents.
- 2. The Request For Proposals ("RFP") and these Standard Terms and Conditions together constitute the entire agreement of the parties ("the Agreement") with regard to any and all matters. By your submission of a bid proposal or response to the City's RFP, you accept these Standard Terms & Conditions and agree that they supersede any conflicting provisions provided by bid or in any terms and conditions contained or linked within a bid and/or response. Changes in the terms and conditions of the Agreement, or the scope of work thereunder, may only be made by a writing signed by the parties.
- 3. You are an independent contractor and in no way does this Agreement render you an employee or agent of the City or entitle you to fringe benefits, workers' compensation, pension obligations, retirement or any other employment benefits. The City shall not deduct federal or state income taxes, social security or Medicare withholdings, or any other taxes required to be deducted by an employer, and this is your responsibility to yourself and your employees and agents.
- 4. You shall not assign your rights and obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the City. Any assignment without prior written consent of the City shall be voidable at the election of the City. The City retains the right to refuse any and all assignments in the City's sole and absolute discretion.
- 5. Invoices submitted to the City shall be payable sixty (60) days from the time of receipt by the City. Invoices shall include support documentation necessary to evidence completion of the work being invoiced. The City may request any other reasonable documentation in support of an invoice. The time for payment shall not commence, and invoices shall not be processed for payment, until you provide reasonably sufficient support documentation. In no circumstances shall the City be obligated to pay or shall you be entitled to receive interest on any overdue invoice or payment. In no circumstances shall the City be obligated to

- pay any costs associated with your collection of an outstanding invoice.
- 6. For contracts involving construction, alteration, and/or repair work, the provisions of applicable state labor law concerning payment of prevailing wage rates (R.I. Gen. Laws §§ 37-13-1 et seq., as amended) and the City's First Source Ordinance (Providence Code of Ordinances §§ 21-91 et seq., as amended) apply.
- 7. With regard to any issues, claims, or controversies that may arise under this Agreement, the City shall not be required to submit to dispute resolution or mandatory/binding arbitration. Nothing prevents the parties from mutually agreeing to settle any disputes using mediation or non-binding arbitration.
- 8. To the fullest extent permitted by law, you shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City, its employees, officers, agents, and assigns from and against any and all claims, damages, losses, allegations, demands, actions, causes of action, suits, obligations, fines, penalties, judgments, liabilities, costs and expenses, including but not limited to attorneys' fees, of any nature whatsoever arising out of, in connection with, or resulting from the performance of the work provided in the Agreement.
- 9. You shall maintain throughout the term of this Agreement the insurance coverage that is required by the RFP or, if none is required in the RFP, insurance coverage that is considered in your industry to be commercially reasonable, and you agree to name the City as an additional insured on your general liability policy and on any umbrella policy you carry.
- 10. The City shall not subject itself to any contractual limitations on liability. The City shall have the time permitted within the applicable statute of limitations, and no less, to bring or assert any and all causes of action, suits, claims or demands the City may have arising out of, in connection with, or resulting from the performance of the work provided in the Agreement, and in no event does the City agree to limit your liability to the price of the Agreement or any other monetary limit.
- 11. The City may terminate this Agreement upon five (5) days' written notice to you if you fail to observe any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, or if the City believes your ability to perform the



terms and conditions of this Agreement has been materially impaired in any way, including but in no way limited to loss of insurance coverage, lapsing of a surety bond, if required, declaration of bankruptcy, or appointment of a receiver. In the event of termination by the City, you shall be entitled to just and equitable compensation for any satisfactory work completed and expenses incurred up to the date of termination.

- 12. Written notice hereunder shall be deemed to have been duly served if delivered in person to the individual or member of the firm or entity or to an officer of the entity for whom it was intended, or if delivered at or sent by registered or certified mail to the last business address known by the party providing notice.
- 13. In no event shall the Agreement automatically renew or be extended without a writing signed by the parties.
- 14. You agree that products produced or resulting from the performance of the Agreement are the sole property of the City and may not be used by you without the express written permission of the City.
- 15. For any Agreement involving the sharing or exchange of data involving potentially confidential and/or personal information, you shall comply with any and all state and/or federal laws or regulations applicable to confidential and/or personal information you receive from the City, including but not limited to the Rhode Island Identity Theft Protection Act, R.I. Gen. Laws § 11-49.3-1, during the term of the Agreement. You shall implement and maintain appropriate physical, technical, and administrative security measures for the protection of, and to prevent access to, use, or disclosure of, confidential and/or personal information. In the event of a breach of such information, you shall notify the City of such breach immediately, but in no event later than twenty-four (24) hours after discovery of such breach.
- 16. The Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of Rhode Island. You expressly submit yourself to and agree that any and all actions arising out of, in connection with, or resulting from the performance of the Agreement or relationship between the parties shall occur solely in the venue and jurisdiction of the State of Rhode Island or the federal court located in Rhode Island.
- 17. The failure of the City to require performance of any provision shall not affect the City's right to

- require performance at any time thereafter, nor shall a waiver of any breach or default of this Agreement constitute a waiver of any subsequent breach or default or a waiver of the provision itself.
- 18. If any term or provision of this Agreement, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall, in any extent, be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby, and each term and provision shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.
